In January 2017, we had the following criminal incidents in the Residential District of Hedwig Village:

Assault

On January 20, 2017, at a residential construction site on Bunker Hill, a contractor and a day laborer had a physical confrontation. Both combatants were cited and released.

Identity Theft

On January 28, 2017, a resident on Sprucewood reported his personal information was used to obtain a credit card.
